

Cheat Sheet - How to find a great shelter dog

- 1. Check his kennel. If his kennel is clean and he does his business right away when taken outside, chances are he's house-trained.
- 2. Say sit. A dog that sits when you ask has been taught a thing or two.
- **3. Give him the once-over.** Ask a shelter worker to touch the dog's paws, tail and haunches and see if he reacts gently or violently.
- **4. Pass up the puppy.** Older dogs sleep through the night and are less likely to have accidents inside and be destructive while you're away.
- **5.** Adopt a dog in foster care. It's the easiest way to assess a dog's personality and energy level away from the kennel environment. And foster parents can give you an honest heads-up about the dog's strengths and challenges.

DIY – Using Vertical Space For Your Cats

Cats see everything from the floor to the ceiling as part of their territory. Below are two examples of Do It Yourself (DIY) projects designed to use vertical space for your cats. The example on the left uses drawers and book shelf holders to create spaces on a wall in an unused corner. On the right, an old serving tray is repurposed as a window seat for your babies. 


Cat of the Month
